Australian Standard 2550.1-2011

The recent release of Australian Standard "2550.1-2011 Cranes, hoists and winches – Safe Use", has updated the servicing requirements for your equipment. All cranes now require Third-party Inspections every 52 weeks.

"AS 2550.1-2011 Clause 1.4.15 Third-part inspection", states:

Periodic Third-party inspections – What does it mean?



Extract below of Section 7.3.4 and Section 1.4.15 from AS 2550.1-2011

7.3.4 Periodic third party inspections

Each crane shall undergo a periodic third-party inspection to provide independent advice on whether the level of maintenance and repairs are in accordance with this standard.

The frequency of the periodic third-party inspection shall be based on the working environment and the frequency and severity of use of the crane.

Note: The periods specified in Table F1 should not be exceeded.

1.4.15 Definition of Third –party inspection

An inspection carried out by an independent competent person, who is not involved in the maintenance of the crane.

Note: For the purpose of this definition, 'independent' means not employed by the same organisation unless that organisation uses a quality process that confirms independence.
